MARSALIS MANSION MOTEL MARKER UNVEILING ON JANUARY 9

On Friday, January 9, 2015 at 11 a.m., the Jefferson Parish Historical Commission will unveil its latest Louisiana Historical Highway Marker, which will commemorate the Marsalis Mansion Motel. The unveiling will be at the former site of the motel, Shrewsbury Road at River Road.

In 1944, Ellis L. Marsalis, Sr. (1908-2004) opened a motel at 110 Shrewsbury Road for African Americans at a time of segregation. It was the only motel for people of color in Greater New Orleans, until Mason's Motel opened in New Orleans 18 years later. Guests reportedly included Martin Luther King, Jr., Adam Clayton Powell, Thurgood Marshall, Amos and Andy, and Ray Charles. The motel was variably known as Marsalis' Motel, Marsalis Mansion, and Marsalis Tourist Home. It closed in 1986 and was demolished in 1993.

Marsalis served on the Jefferson Parish Republican Executive Committee. Marsalis fathered Ellis, Jr., who, along with his sons, are famous for their contributions to Jazz.

There are also several marker dedications, tours, etc., per year. All functions are open to members and their guests (banquet and tours are admission-by-fee only). The "JHS Newsletter" is mailed bimonthly, and irregularly published issues of the Jefferson History Notebook series are free to members.
